- ✓ Enduro 2 (E2): 250+ cc 4 stroke up to 450cc 4 stroke
- ✓ Enduro 3 (E3): 250+ cc 2 stroke and 450+ cc 4 stroke
- ✓ EnduroGP (EGP): Rankings based on overall standings (E1-E2-E3)

## ➤ JUNIORS

Age limit 23 years.

Junior 1 and Junior 2 categories:

- ✓ FIM Enduro Junior 1 World Cup (J1): Up to 250 cc 2 stroke and 4 stroke
- ✓ FIM Enduro Junior 2 World Cup (J2): 250+ cc 2 stroke and 4 stroke

The final rankings will take into account all results in Junior 1 and Junior 2.

The FIM Junior Enduro World Champion will be decided based on the overall rankings of the Junior 1 and Junior 2 categories.

## ➤ YOUTH

Age limit 21 years.

The final rankings will take into account all results.

## ➤ WOMEN
